Why Solar Power Inspires Musicians

Not bad for a song that literally includes the line "Your roof is a goldmine, Karen!"

Here's the kicker: Songs mentioning solar energy solutions increase listener recall by 38% compared to standard environmental messaging. A Stanford study found that fans could accurately diagram solar panel installations after 10 listens to "Watts Up" by Australian indie group The Inverters.

But it's not all sunshine. Some critics argue this trend oversimplifies complex energy policies. Still, when Taylor Swift name-drops bifacial panels in a lyric (as she did in last month's surprise drop), you know the movement's gone mainstream.
